Dear Members.

Your Executive Board members will journey to Washington DC to visit with our elected officials to ask for their support for various bills before congress, both in the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The bills we are asking support for are:

HR-82 and S-597 – Repeal Windfall Elimination Provision and Government Pension Offset. Currently, Social Security benefits are reduced for retirees with a government pension, whether local, State of Federal, including Civil Service Retirement System and Federl Employees Retirement System retirees. These proposed bills, if passed and signed into law, would effectively remove these reductions from the Social Security payments.

HR-594 – Manager Fairness. This bill would force a timelier consultative process between NAPS and USPS.

HR-595 – USPS employee appeal rights act. There are approximately 2500 NAPS members nationwide without MSPB appeal rights. This bill would extend those rights to those members.

HR-716 – Fair COLA for Seniors. This bill would cause the COLA adjustment calculations to be based CPI-E numbers, the index more closely aligned with the purchases more commonly made by seniors.

HR-866 – Equal COLA for CSRS and FERS retirees. This bill would eliminate the 1% reduction in annuities for FERS retirees.

HR-3005 and S-3356 – Postal Police reform act. This bill clarifies the jurisdiction of the Postal Police to restore the officers' law enforcement authority beyond the perimeter of a postal facility, and to protect postal personnel, USPS assets, and the mail.


Motion carried (J Kerr/J Bennett) to adjourn the meeting at 7:05 PM.


